

3D Printer Advancements

\$25,000 February 2024

"The grant from the Cedarburg Education Foundation has had a remarkable impact on our Technology and Engineering program at Cedarburg High School. With the upgraded equipment, our capstone students have been able to take their design and engineering skills to the next level, beyond what normal 3D printing has allowed. They've applied their knowledge to create functional, real-world solutions, including custom replacement handles for a truck topper, specialized fixtures for our tube bender, and carbon fiber-reinforced parts for a robotics project. These hands-on projects have provided invaluable learning experiences, preparing our students for future careers in engineering and manufacturing.
