The CEF provides grant funding to support curriculum innovation including equipment and materials for School District students, teachers, administrators, and staff members.

On behalf of the Cedarburg Education Foundation (CEF) Board, I am excited to share with you the incredible accomplishments of our Foundation in 2021. As the world continued to persevere through a global pandemic, our Foundation, the Cedarburg School District, and our amazing Cedarburg Community continued our partnerships to elevate the education experience for all Cedarburg students.

We returned to an in-person Gala in 2021 and set a new fundraising record by raising over \$150,000 for our students in a single evening! What an amazing outpouring of support from our community! In addition, the CEF remains incredibly grateful to our business community partners, including the WILO Foundation for their four-year commitment, which resulted in over \$23,000 in 2021, and to Olsen's Piggly Wiggly who maintained their commitment to the "Round Up" program donating over \$7,200 in 2021. These successful fundraising initiatives and all our corporate partnerships enabled the CEF to raise over \$175,000, fund over \$78,000 in grants, and fund our endowment with an additional \$85,000. This additional endowment funding pushed our endowment over \$500,000, accomplishing a goal set out by our founding members back in 2006, and securing the Foundation's financial stability for years to come.

The CEF continues to be especially grateful to the faculty and staff of the Cedarburg School District. It is humbling to witness firsthand their continued support for our students and families while they continue to juggle the challenges of serving our community during a pandemic. Their ability to adapt and persevere while still finding the time to apply for CEF grants that will enrich student learning throughout the district is inspiring.

The CEF board continued to evolve and grow in 2021 as we welcomed additional board members and student ambassadors. I am thankful for the commitment and efforts of so many talented and generous volunteers.

MAKERSPACE 2.0 GRANT IMPACT : ENGINEERING

The Makerspace grant also incorporated the ability for young learners to explore the opportunity of **engineering**. Lego kits were given to 5K-5th grade students to provide a hands-on activity to engage children in new learnings. The Lego League team was created after the Legos were implemented in classrooms. These young learners were able to connect with Webster Middle School and other elementary schools like Thorson to successfully complete the Boomtown Build challenge. This after school club for 1st-5th graders improved their thinking skills, creativity, and ability to work with others.
